TBAP Mission:

“TBAP Exists to empower children who have been disadvantaged to thrive now and in the future”

1. Purpose

1.1 This report provides headlines about recent TBAP executive activity and details the progress of TBAP strategic objectives.

2. TBAP 2020 Vision - Principle 1

SUCCESS FOR LEARNERS BY ANY MEANS

“We design and adapt so that success for young people is a non-negotiable”

2.1 Local Advisory Boards (LABs) continue to meet for each AP Academy. The Head of School Term 4 reports on the quality of Teaching, Learning and Assessment to the LABs are included in the Board papers for information. All LAB reports, agendas and minutes are published on the TBAP website: <http://www.tbap.org.uk/the-trust/lab-agendas-minutes-meetings.php>

2.4 The designs for the TBAP Hub building project are currently out for formal public consultation with a view to submit to the planning committee on March 10th. Two formal pre-planning public consultation sessions were hosted at The Bridge AP Academy on February 20th and 21st. We now expect construction to commence in late 2017 and be completed by the summer of 2018. Senior Leaders are meeting on a regular basis to plan for the decant of KS4 to a refurbished Latimer building, in Sept 2017; KS3 and 16-19 will remain on the TBAP Campus (Finlay Street) site whilst building works progress.

2.5 I am pleased to report that staff and learners have taken occupation of the new / refurbished site at St Neot’s. Learners are responding well to the new site and Secretary of State, Rt Hon Justine Greening will be opening the Academy at the end of March

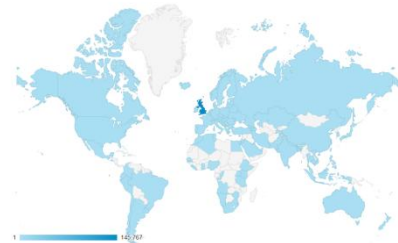
2.6 We submitted bids to all three strands of the DfE MAT Growth Fund. The bids include a proposal to develop a Northern Hub centred around New Horizons PRU in Warrington with a focus on supporting PRUs in Blackpool. To date, we have been informed that our bid to develop our existing hubs has been awarded £60 K

2.7 The Tri-borough Local Authorities have informed us that they are not able to fund the TBAP residence beyond Easter. Following meetings with the Director of Children’s Services, Clare Chamberlain CBE and the DfE Chief Social worker, Isabelle Trowler, we submitted an additional bid for a remodelled TBAP Residence to the Social Innovation Fund. Unfortunately our bid was not progressed to the next stage. At the HRFP committee meeting on March 8th we made the difficult decision to close the Residence and hand the building back to the DfE. I will inform staff at a meeting on Monday March 13th. Our intention is to offer staff the opportunity to redeploy within TBAP.

2.8 The TBAP Foundation continues to support a wide range of additional activities across the Trust. Most recently, grants have been made to provide music equipment, enrichment equipment and books. Trevor Button is running the London Marathon to raise funds and the Foundation is planning to hold another fundraising event in the autumn term. Following an invitation to attend the Worshipful Company of Butchers lunch and annual Boars Head Ceremony, we have been fortunate enough to secure an apprenticeship with a local butcher for one of our Y11 learners at Latimer.

2.9 TBAP delivers great outcomes and our young learners consistently articulate the value of our offer when they act as ambassadors to visitors. We celebrate the varied and diverse achievements through our blog and Twitter feed on the TBAP website. The local advisory board reports detail the many learner achievements across TBAP but I would like to bring particular attention to the following projects that have occurred since my last report in December:

- Fishing at Octavia
- Learners delivering BBC News report at Bridge
- Continued delivery of excellent IB lessons at the 16-19 Academic AP Academy
- Shannon being awarded the BEA national award
- Exceptional learner ambassadors
- TSA leading the Women Leaders in Education event
- Social media: we use a range of channels to communicate with learners, families and other stakeholders. These include a blog, Twitter feeds and website. Over the last year we have had 149,673 visits to our website from more than 121 countries. We have 2,752 followers on Twitter with over 81 individual TBAP Twitter accounts



2.10 The learner population across TBAP is summarised in **Appendix A**. The learner population remains at an expected level and will grow as the year progresses. There are currently 448 learners on roll across TBAP. We place learners in the most appropriate provision to meet their needs as an individual and have a number of learners who are attending a TBAP

provision that is not situated within their home borough. These placements are reviewed by TBAP RLTs on a regular basis to ensure individual needs are successfully met.

3. TBAP 2020 Vision - Principle 2

PRECISE INCLUSION

“We listen to our learners, seeking to understand their ‘journey’ and difficulties in their lives that make engagement a challenge.”

- 3.1 This year has seen the introduction of our new assessment policy which was produced as our response to Life after Levels. Staff have worked hard to replicate some of our excellent primary practice across the academies. This has included the deployment of a new software package called Pupil Asset which is being populated by staff to help us produce real time reports for all learners on the TBAP Progress 5 measures.
- 3.2 There are a total of 83 learners with Education Health and Care Plans or statements across TBAP. Table 6 details the SEN breakdown for each LA and annual review dates.
- 3.3 The TBAP TSA continues to make exceptional progress under the leadership of Sarah Hardy. Please see the enclosed report for a summary of progress against the 6 strands this term.
- 3.4 There is now a therapy offer in place across TBAP academies and the therapists are beginning to make a real impact on the mental health of learners and staff. Jackie Lindeck produces a monthly report detailing outcomes which is reviewed at ELT.
- 3.5 TBAP Schools are continuing with delivery of a new restorative approach with staff training being delivered by Luke Roberts, a leading trainer in conflict resolution and restorative approaches. This is facilitating the delivery of “reset conversations” when mediation is required.

4. TBAP 2020 Vision - Principle 3

STARTING AT GREAT

“For our learners there is no ‘good enough’, we are committed to being exceptional in every respect”

4.1 Our aim is for every TBAP Academy and service to be rated as Outstanding by Ofsted. All TBAP Academies undergo an annual Challenge Partners’ Review which gives us a very clear indication of which areas require improvement or further development. The following table summarises TBAP sites today:-

4.2 3 Ofsted inspections have taken place at TBAP Academies since the last report and I would like to thank all staff and learners for their exemplary hard work during these inspections. In all cases the governance has been recognised as strength and the work of Directors and LABs has been noted as effective. Whilst the movement of the Bridge from ‘Outstanding’ to ‘Good overall’ was disappointing, the new leadership team now have a clear goal to aim for in 2020. It was particularly pleasing to see such a fantastic result from our sponsored academy, the Octagon in Haringey. This was judged as ‘Good with Outstanding leadership, management and personal welfare’. This is a real testament to the work of Angela Tempany and the team at the Octagon who have moved it on from Special Measures in under 3 years. The Ofsted at Beachcroft was also a great outcome with Andrew Burton and his team delivering a secure Good judgement in all areas.

- 4.3 We have decided to review the effectiveness of the Challenge Partners review process as the recent Ofsted inspections have highlighted a disparity in judgements. We are exploring the option of developing a 'TBAP' AP/Special review package.
- 4.4 Many of our sites are proudly displaying the Investors in People Silver Plaque. The Staff Well-being committee are meeting to further develop the action plan with a view to us achieving Gold or Platinum status.
- 4.5 All academies and services across TBAP are following the same self-evaluation and monitoring cycle. All teams are working to the TBAP and local development plans which are uploaded on Bluewave Swift. All local development plans have been revised to reflect the TBAP 2020 vision. All sites have produced a school self-evaluation forms (SEF) which have been forwarded to the Board and are uploaded on each Bluewave Swift deployment.
- 4.6 TBAP Learner Progress Observations (Lesson Observations), Learner Classroom Checkpoints (learning walks), Learner Progress Portfolio Check Point (book-looks and work scrutiny) are ongoing in all TBAP academies. HoS reports to the LAB should be consulted for summary positions. We are reviewing these processes as we introduce our new approach to the assessment of teaching and learning this year.
- 4.7 I continue to attend Regional Headteacher Board (HTB) meetings chaired by the Regional Schools Commissioner Martin Post. In this role we review Free School and Academy applications and consider underperforming academies or trusts. I have also participated as a panel member on a number of Free School application interviews. The TBAP Trust is paid by the DfE for this work.
- 4.8 During half term I co-chaired a workshop on AP at the DfE. Sarah Hardy attended and TBAP was again well-represented at a National Level.
- 4.9 Tony Meehan represented TBAP on a panel during half term at the London launch of the Chartered College of Teaching
- 4.10 My role as a Youth Justice Board member has been extended to September 2017. Lord McNally has completed his tenure as Chair of the YJB. Charlie Taylor has now taken on this role and will lead the YJB Board through the next round of reforms which will see the creation of a Youth Justice division in the Ministry of Justice.
- 4.11 I recently completed a number of visits to Secure children's homes in Bristol, Nottingham, Leeds and Sheffield .
- 4.12 I was honoured to attend an investiture on February 23rd at Buckingham Palace to receive a CBE from the Queen. It was an incredible experience and I feel very proud that the hard work and achievements of TBAP staff and learners has been recognised in such a way.
