We aim to foster a love of reading by exposing learners to a wide range of challenging literary texts, to introduce them to an inspiring range of nonfiction and to encourage their independent reading for pleasure (as well as developing their analytical skills).
KS3	Mathematics			Learners are taught all the basic areas of Mathematics in line with the National Curriculum for Key Stage Three including Numeracy, Algebra, Shape and Space, Probability and Statistics.  Internal key assessments are conducted in termly modules to measure learners' progress. These are used alongside class work to ensure development.
KS3	Science			At KS3, learners will start by studying cells. This topic will be preceded by an introduction to science and self-assessment will be used. This will be followed by a unit on reproduction and finally learners will study adaptation and classification.  Following a general introduction to chemistry, learners will study mixing, dissolving and separating, and become familiar with the use of key words



		and carrying out experiments. They will then focus on elements, compounds and reactions.  In physics, learners will start by studying fuels and renewable energy resources. They will move on to the use of energy by plants. Following this they will study circuits and the use of electricity at home. Finally they study forces and the solar system.
