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| Willows KS1&2 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Literacy • Numeracy • Science • Art and Craft • Physical Education • Project Based Learning • Enrichment | <p>Our Willows centre consists of a small primary cohort of up to 10 learners. Learners range from Reception through to year 6. In our Willows Centre we offer a broad and balanced Primary Curriculum in a small nurturing environment where learners feel safe. Learners attend full school days and expectations are high yet achievable. Learners needs are supported through a wide range of Neurological and Trauma Informed approaches such as Neuro Linguistic Programming and our own Kaleidoscope Learning Process. Literacy and Numeracy is delivered, and progress is tracked through age related Personalised Learning Checklists (PLC's) tailored to each individual learner ensuring accessible and differentiated learning for each learner.</p> <p>Subjects are delivered through Project Based Learning ensuring learners are engaged and develop a love for learning; something which may have been lost along their learning journey.</p> <p>Enrichment activities are regularly built in to the curriculum with educational visits, project- based activities and rewards. Learners may have access to multi therapies including Art therapy, Dog therapy and Play therapy if agreed with agencies.</p> |

Learners in this centre range from year 7 to year 9 and placements vary from short 12- week placements to longer placements of up to a year. Oaks vision is to ensure that learners re-engage in education and learning through a broad, balanced and highly engaging curriculum. Staff are trained in Neurological and Trauma Informed approaches and curriculum is informed and tailored to each individual cohort and their needs through the Kaleidoscope Learning Programme.</p> <p>Learners are encouraged to re-engage with learning through Project Based Learning where a love for learning can be re-established and nurtured. Learners are given the opportunity to learn about things that interest them and are supported through a range of interventions, support and therapies such as 1:1/small group Literacy and Numeracy interventions, behaviour and pastoral support and Art and Dog Therapy.</p> |

Educational trips, visits, team building, sensory garden projects and fundraising feature regularly in this centre's curriculum providing learners with every opportunity possible for them to succeed.</p> |

Learners in this centre join us at various times of the year and whilst the majority of these learners complete their education with us some are only with us for a short- term placement.</p> <p>Redwood's vision is to ensure that all learners have access to achieving a variety of qualifications including option subjects and that all learners leave with qualifications and a secure pathway into post 16. Redwood staff are trained in Neurological and Trauma informed approaches and the curriculum is delivered through our Kaleidoscope Learning Process to ensure learners need are continually met. Relationships between staff and learners are paramount and learners are supported through Behaviour and Youth Education Mentors, Pastoral support, Art, Music and Dog Therapy and multi-agency support where appropriate.</p> <p>All learners complete core subjects of Maths, English and Science along with Catering and Business qualifications. Option subjects are offered to learners providing them with a choice of subjects and qualifications and the Duke of Edinburgh Award is available for all learners. Enrichment activities play an important part of Redwood curriculum. Dellagio Rugby Works work with learners once per week in school and learners attend regular football fixtures, a local gym and a driving range as part of their curriculum offer.</p> |

Currently offering a wide variety of subjects it is the vision of Cedars staff to offer vulnerable learners a nurturing and caring environment in which they can access their learning without the pressures of a larger school environment. With a maximum of up to 10 places, Cedars staff are trained in Neuro Linguistic programming and trauma informed practices enabling them to support our learners and their needs. Multi agency work is supported through our pastoral team, centre leads and head of student services when needed and learners supported with all aspects of their social, emotional and mental health. Learners receive personalised education packages in line with our whole school Kaleidoscope Learning programme providing learners with every opportunity to succeed in an education environment. Learners are also given the opportunity and support to self- study any qualifications they would like to continue which we do not offer as part of our curriculum. Cedars learners in year 11 are supported by our careers lead and all learners leave with a secure destination pathway having completed applications, college/apprenticeships visits and taster sessions to ensure the best chance of success post 16.</p> |
